ACES Office Now Open, Suspended Services Resume

With advice of the Amador County Health Dept. and relaxing of state-ordered restrictions, the ACES Customer Service office re-opened to the public on July 1, 2020.

ORANGE BAG RECYCLING COLLECTION RESUMES

Starting July 1, ACES resumed collection of Orange Bags, and bags are being distributed to all households that regularly use Orange Bags for recycling.

EXTRA ITEMS MAY BE BAGGED AND LEFT FOR PICK-UP

- ACES drivers can now pick up “extra” items that are bagged and placed outside of an ACES container.

COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP DAYS RESUME

- Fall Clean-up within city limits of Ione, Jackson, Sutter Creek & Plymouth will be held Oct. 12 - 16, 2020.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP-OFF RESUMES

- Bi-monthly Household Hazardous Waste drop-off days at the Buena Vista Transfer Station have resumed. Please

see story on reverse for days and acceptable items. Please don't place household hazardous waste in with your regular trash, yard waste, or recycling carts or bins.

E-WASTE DROP OFF DAILY

- Electronics (TVs, cell phones, microwaves, computers, etc.) can be dropped off daily during regular hours at both ACES Transfer Stations. No more than four of the same type of item per visit.

TRANSFER STATIONS REMAIN OPEN

- ACES Transfer Stations in Pine Grove and Buena Vista are open. Operators will not be able to help unload. Restrooms are not open to the public. Transfer Station hours are posted at www.ACESWaste.com.

Amador County residents can drop off household hazardous waste for FREE at the Buena Vista Transfer Station, Lone, 9 am - 1 pm, every other Saturday. Up to 15 gallons or 125 lbs per trip. Commercial customers contact Amador County Waste Management for recycling in quantity: 209-223-6429.

ACCEPTED: Paint, Chemicals, Batteries, Medications & Needles, Fluorescent Tubes & Bulbs, Gasoline & Brake Fluid, Mercury Products, Pool Chemicals.

NOT ACCEPTED: Explosives, Ammunition, Narcotics, Radioactive Waste. No Business Waste.
