If you think pick-up trucks have gotten expensive lately, you should see the prices of garbage trucks.

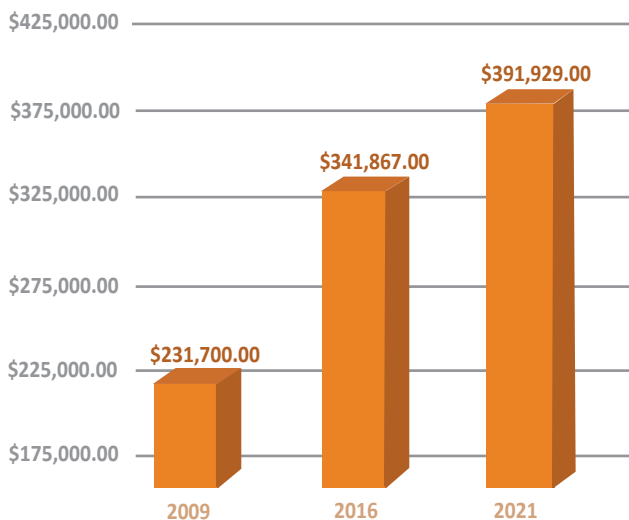
ACES' CEO Paul Molinelli, Sr., recalls that he bought his first new garbage truck in 1967 for \$16,000. Today a new truck is over \$390,000, with prices almost doubling over the last 20 years.

ACES' trucks have to cover a lot of territory, picking up

all over Amador County from the Sacramento County line to Kirkwood and hauling waste and recyclables to the Valley. We do our best to maintain our fleet to keep trucks on the road as long as possible but, just like your personal vehicles, eventually they have to be replaced.

Keeping our equipment moving and our drivers in safe vehicles is a big part of what we do at ACES.

Accidents happen -- And ACES is prepared

Recently, one of our trucks leaked hydraulic oil (used in the truck's lift systems), creating what could have been a hazardous waste spill.



The truck's driver immediately took all the required spill containment steps to prevent the oil from spreading — all ACES drivers are trained in spill prevention and response, and all our trucks carry a spill containment kit.

For additional environmental protection, the hydraulic oil used in ACES trucks is an eco-friendly, highly refined mineral oil, classified as "not hazardous" by regulators.

Memorial Day: Normal collection, Office & Transfer Stations closed.

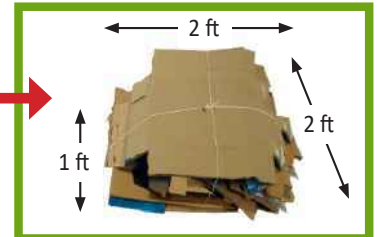
Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off:
